Profile SY 2018-19

Our Community- James B. Castle High School, established in 1951, is located in Kaneohe, on the Windward side of the island of Oahu. Considered a commuter community, 94.7 percent of the adult population work outside the area. Once considered rural, it is now a densely populated residential area (population of 35,000) with a mix of condominiums, single family dwellings, acre estates, five small public housing complexes, commercial businesses, and some light industry. The median family income was \$92,257 (2012-2016 American Community Survey 5-year estimates). There are eight elementary schools and one intermediate school that feed into Castle High School.

The School- James B. Castle High School is a four-year public high school, grades 9-12, with a current enrollment of 1127 students and 85 teaching faculty for the 2017-2018 school year including a senior class of 263 students. Currently 45% of the school population qualify for the federally assisted free or reduced lunch program. The needs of exceptional students are supported by special education and 504 programming.

Approximately 50% of our students identify as Pacific Islander, 24% Asian, 10% White, 8% Multiple, 7% Hispanic, and 1% Black.

Castle High was accredited in 2017 by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges for a period of 6 years, and adopted School-Community-Council in place of School/Community Based Management.
